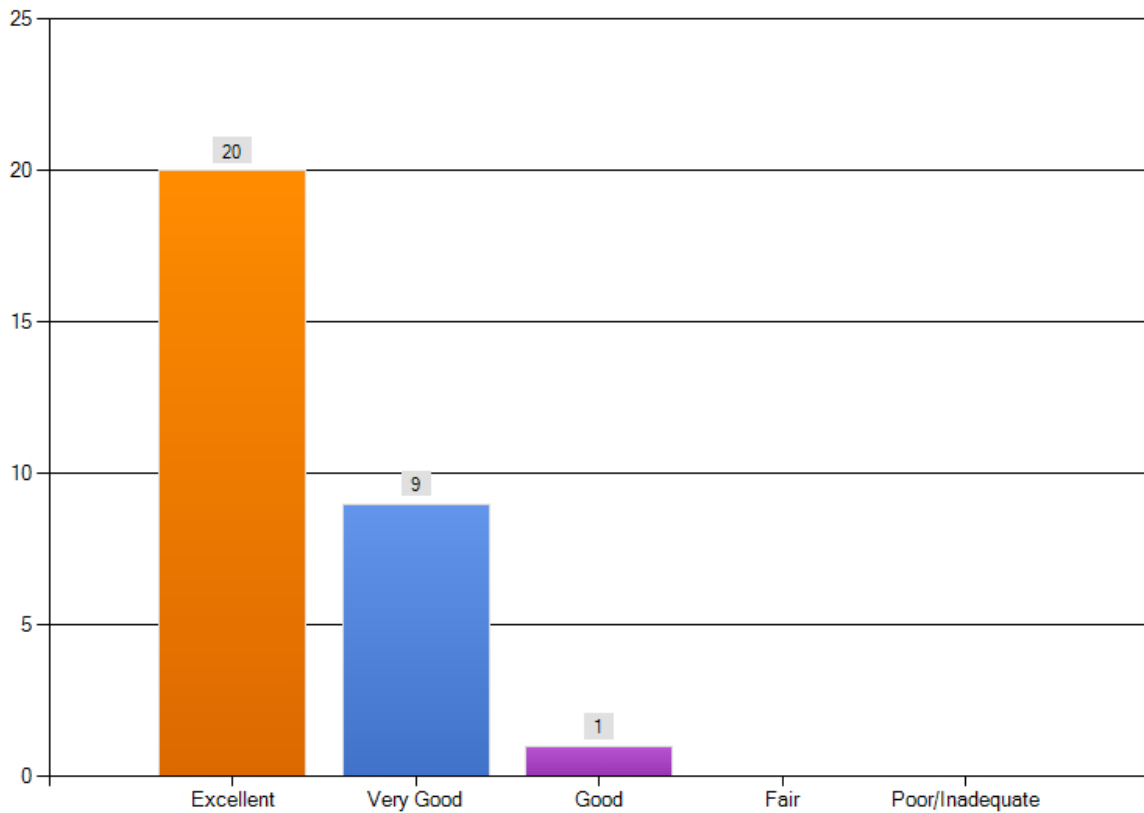

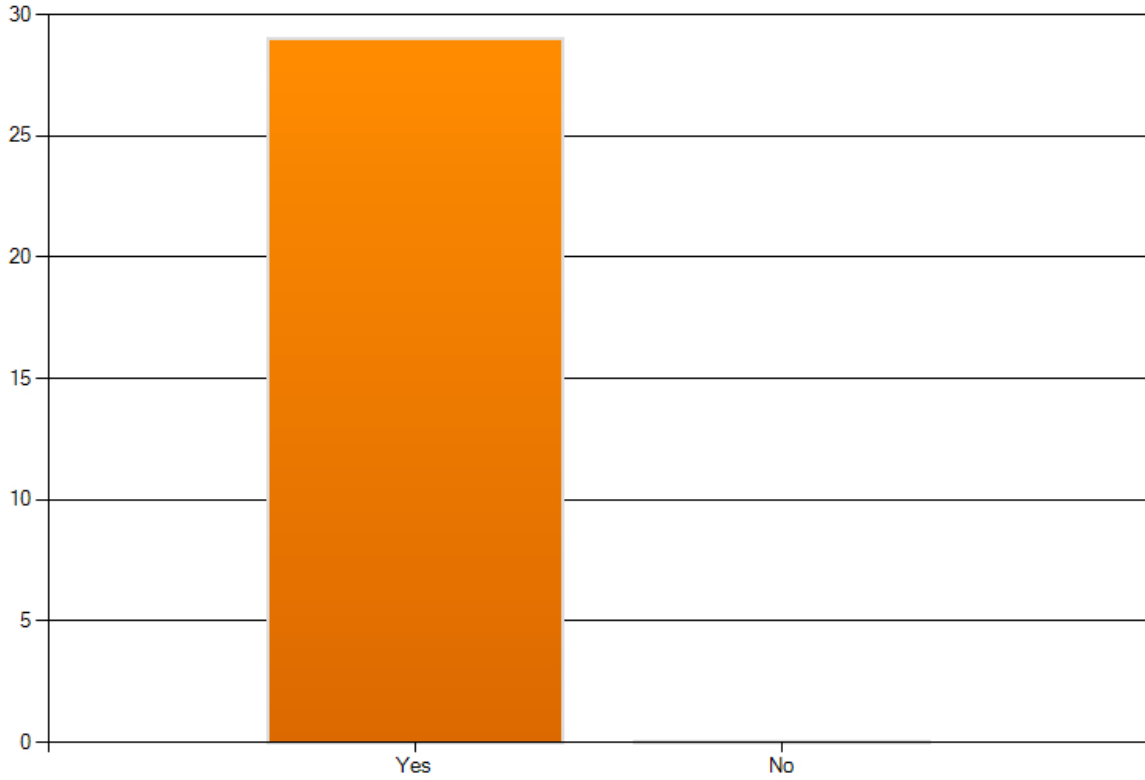
Earth, Water, Air, and Fire: Are You Ready?

Your overall rating of the session:

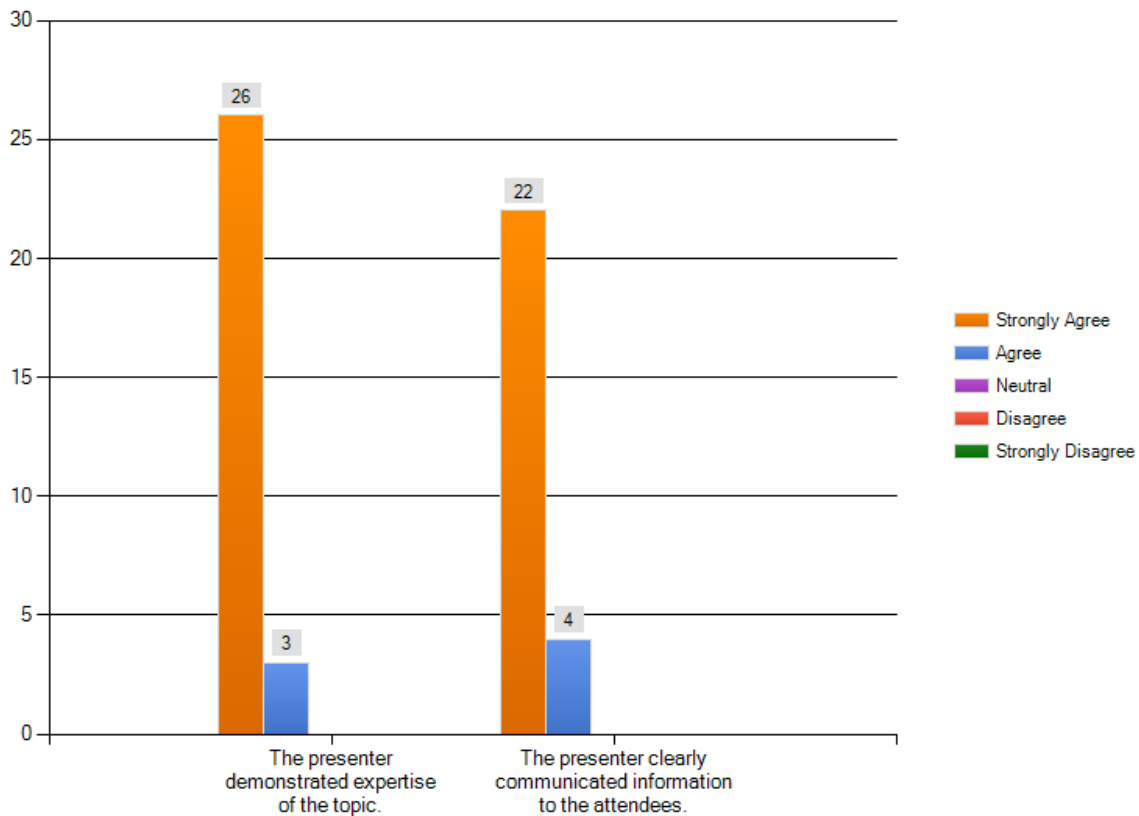




Is it likely you will use the information from this session when you return to your campus?

What was the most interesting or useful thing discussed during this session?

“The spreadsheets they offered to share.”

“Given that the presenters had actually experienced an event, they were well versed to present information on what happened that was unexpected and not planned for.”

“Pre-planning information - practice what has been put in place.”

“This is what actually happened and what worked and what didn't work.”

“Have a plan and do the drills. When you are in the actual crisis, this will help immensely.”

“To come up with one take away topic.”

“Unforeseen conditions during the event.”

“The need to have an emergency response plan in place and DRILL, DRILL, DRILL. The fact that 80% of all emergency response plans uncover fatal flaws when tested. I appreciated the presenters' candor about problems they encountered. They weren't afraid to share what went well AND what went wrong. We can all benefit from their experience. Both presenters had excellent PowerPoint presentations too. The images were very helpful in understanding the magnitude of a catastrophic loss.”

“Details of the planning that went on before the crisis and what they learned was missing in their plans.”

“The need for documentation of actions you take and the need to have an accurate inventory of items before a disaster occurs.”
